this study chronicles the rise of psychology as a tool for social analysis during the cold war era and the concept of the open mind in american culture in the years following world war ii a scientific vision of the rational creative and autonomous self took hold as an essential way of understanding society in the open mind science historian jamie cohen cole demonstrates how this notion of the self became a defining feature of cold war culture from 1945 to 1965 policy makers used this new concept of human nature to advance a centrist political agenda and instigate nationwide educational reforms that promoted more open and indeed more human minds the new field of cognitive science was central to this project helping to overthrow the behaviorist view that the mind either did not exist or could not be studied scientifically while the concept of the open mind initially unified american culture this unity started to fracture between 1965 and 1975 as the ties between political centrism and the scientific account of human nature began to unravel during the late 1960s feminists and the new left repurposed psychological tools to redefine open mindedness as a characteristic of left wing politics as a result once liberal intellectuals became neoconservative and in the early 1970s struggles against open mindedness gave energy and purpose to the right wing

this volume is the second of two volumes of proceedings from the international conference on the replacement of neanderthals by modern humans which took place in tokyo in november 2012 this second volume reports in four major sections findings by cultural anthropologists physical anthropologists engineering scientists and neurophysiologists integrated in multidisciplinary fashion to solidify the overall understanding of the mechanics of replacement from cognitive and physical perspectives part 1 provides examinations of replacement related questions from various perspectives in cognition and psychology part 2 consisting of studies rooted in body science and genetics provides detailed findings which fill in the broader frame of the replacement phenomenon part 3 presents a collection of papers whose findings about fossil crania and brain morphology shed direct light on immediate questions regarding replacement part 4 provides illuminations similar to those in part 3 but arising from the analytical empowerment afforded by neuroscience the collection of 26 papers in this volume makes available to readers both broad and narrow insights on the mechanisms of the replacement assimilation of neanderthals by modern humans and at the same time provides a model of new paradigm multidisciplinary collaboration on a complex problem

classification geomagnetic inverse problem email filtering part iii multimedia computing and social networks addressing topics including but not limited to augmented reality telepresence robot video flash matting community detection quality images face thermal image extraction mri tumor segmentation part v cloud computing and big data mining discussing topics including but not limited to mining on microblogs query optimization big data classification access control friendsourcing and assistive technology part vi swarm optimization and its applications addressing topics including but not limited to solving set covering problem adaptive pso for ct liver segmentation water quality assessment attribute reduction fish detection solving manufacturing cell design problem
